Virtual Backgrounds hosts "Sleep Over" for Key Photographers!

The night before the opening of the 2006 Imaging USA (PPA) convention in Austin, ten photographers (pictured right) from the USA and Canada were hosted by Virtual Backgrounds for an overnight "sleep over" on board Henry and Marian Oles' two historic Pullman sleeping cars. The cars are parked at Virtual Backgrounds in San Marcos, Texas.

The event included a presentation by Henry Oles, Jim Wilson and Trevon Baker followed by a discussion of the value of Virtual Backgrounds to enhance portrait photography.

The group was then served a homemade BBQ dinner on board the Virtual Backgrounds railroad dining car which is regularly used for workshop functions and other events.

The guests then retired to their private suites in two 1947 sleeping cars. Light sleepers counted the passage of 7 freight trains during the night on tracks less than 30 feet away. ## Scene Machine Used to Photograph PPA Degree Recipients

Virtual Backgrounds was contracted for the third year in a row to create the background that was projected behind every degree recipient at the PPA convention in Austin, Texas.

Virtual Backgrounds' Vice President for Education, Jim Wilson, photographed more than 100 degree recipients in a little more than an hour, using four different slides of bronze plaques representing each respective degree. The entire process was coordinated by Ralph Romaguera of Metairie, Louisiana, a suburb of New Orleans.

Before using the Scene Machine to create the background, only a plain photographer's canvas was used as a background. Using Virtual Backgrounds to project the degree recipient's degree helped to capture this special moment and make the occasion meaningful for all.

#### Custom Slides Now Available from VB

Virtual Backgrounds is happy to announce that we can now extend offers to customers to have their digital files made into background slides. Every slide will be mounted on glass-mounted square super slides. If you wish to have a 35mm slide instead of the perfect square, simply create a square canvas, insert your 35mm image, and fill in the remaining area with the color black. It's that easy! Slides are priced at \$10 each with a minimum \$50 order.

Digital files can be uploaded as jpeg images through our FTP transfer page located in the "Background Libraries" section of the website. It is recommended that files are sent as .jpg images with pixel dimensions of 2000 x 2000. Basil and his wife, Margaret (pictured with PPA President Ann Monteigh) were thrilled. They have been married for nearly 56 years! He's had more than enough merits to earn his Craftsman degree for years, but at least 16 merits were lost when PPA converted to a new computer system.

Basil is very well known and loved by many photographers. In 55 years, Basil has missed only two PPA conventions. He also attends and participates in many other conventions and training programs, such as SPA







in Florida and many local and regional conventions. Basil never wants to stop learning and always wants to improve and become a better photographer. rarily slowed him down. He says his new knee will bring him back to normal again shortly.
